



SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2020 Victorian & Open 420 Championships - Appendices P, S & T apply

1. RULES

- 1.1** The regatta will be governed by the Rules as defines in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2** The Constitution and By-Laws of the International 420 Class Association of Australia shall apply.
- 1.3** RRS P2.3 is deleted and RRS P2.2 shall also apply to subsequent penalties.
- 1.4** The Post-Race Penalty in RRS T1(b) is changed to 25% of the difference between a boat's score and RET score.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Notice to Competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB) located at the bottom of the Murdoch Tower.

3. CHANGE TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any changes to Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1** Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flag pole to the north east of the Murdoch Tower.
- 4.2** When AP is displayed ashore, RRS S4.2 is changed to "not less than 30 minutes".

6. CLASS FLAGS

420 Blue insignia on White Flag

7. THE START

RRS S9.2 is changed to: The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee vessel at each end of the start line.

8. THE FINISH

The orange flag in RRS S11 is changed to a blue flag on the Race Committee vessel and a blue and white inflated mark.

9. TIME LIMITS

- Boats not finishing within the Finishing Window may be allocated a score [DP] This changes RRS 35, A4, A5 & S12.3
- 9.2** Failure to meet the target times will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1 (a).

10. SCORING

- 10.1** There will be a maximum of 12 races.
- 10.2** Three races are required to constitute a series.
- 10.3** When fewer than 5 races are completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 10.4** When 6 through to 10 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 10.5** When more than 10 races have been completed, a boats score will be the total of her races scores excluding her worst two scores.

11. PROTEST AND REQUEST FOR REDRESS

Protest forms are available at the race office in the Murdoch Tower. Protests and request for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the a time limit of 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the Race Committee has signaled no more racing today, whichever is the later

12. COURSES

- 12.1** The courses, diagrams and signals referred to In RRS S7 in Appendix S are replaced with those on the next page.
- 12.2** No later than the warning signal, the Race Committee signal vessel shall display the course number and an approximate compass bearing to the first mark.

13. MARKS

1,2,3s,3p	Yellow Inflated
5	Red Inflated
New Mark	Orange Inflated
Finish Pin	Blue & White Inflated.

14. SIGN ON – SIGN OFF

Boats shall sign on before going afloat and sign off at the first reasonable opportunity upon returning ashore (at Regatta Office). 3 points will be added by the Race Committee to the first race result of the day should a boat not sign on, or to the last race of the

day should a boat not sign off within the Protest time frame, without protest.

15. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION [DP]

15.1 Requirements for equipment inspection will be posted on the ONB.

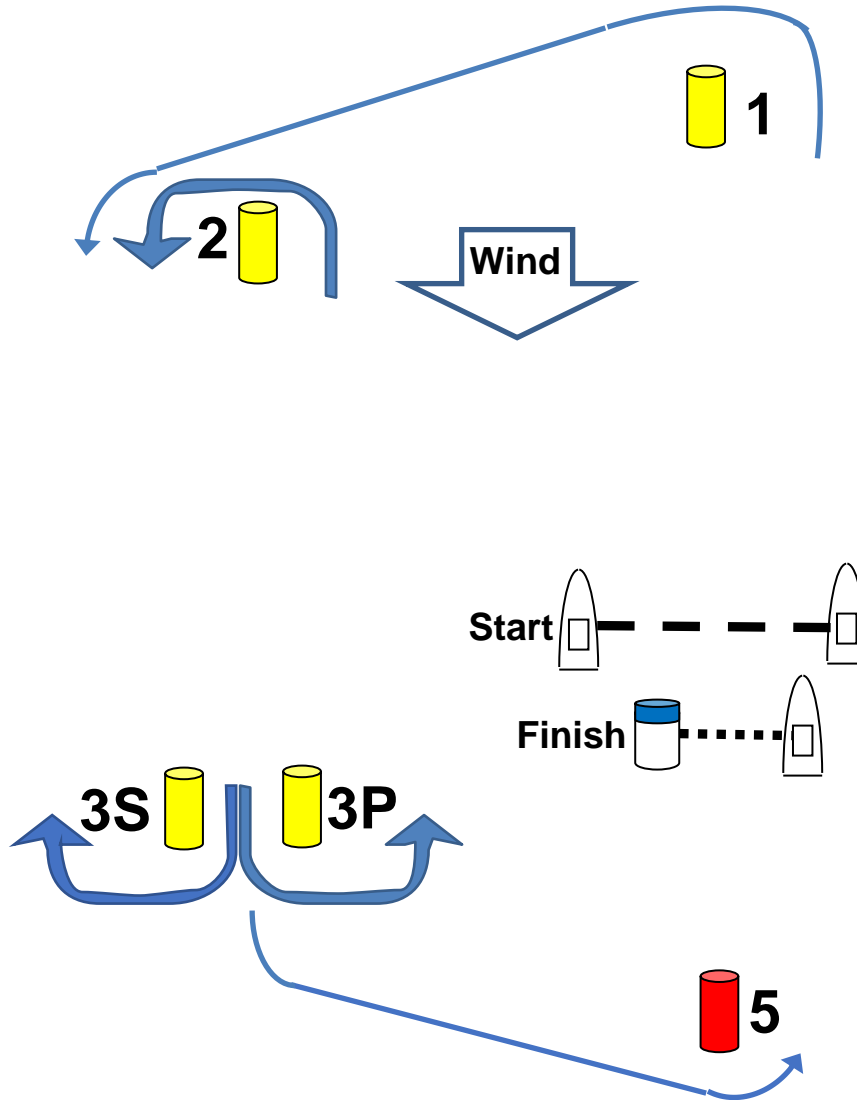
15.2 Penalties for breaches of Class Rules are at the discretion of the Protest Committee.

16. SUPPORT PERSONS

16.1 Support Persons shall stay 100 meters outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the start until all boats

have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment. [DP]

16.2 When Flag V is raised on the Committee Vessel, all support boats are to remain on course and help rescue as indicated by the Race Committee.
